THE KILLING FROST.

IN CANADA.
From all parts of the country come accounts of serious damage to fruit and vegetables by the frost of Friday and Sunday nights.

Around Hamilton the frost has done incalculable damage to fruits and garden truck.

At Thorold the frost badly damaged grapes, peaches, strawberries and cherries and early vegetables. The grain crops are all right.

At Port Dalhousie on Sunday night there was a very hard frost, making about a quarter of an inch of ice. Early corn and other garden vegetables have been cut down entirely. Peaches and grapes are damaged.

At Meaford grapes are all gone and strawberries are damaged very materially.

The frost caused considerable damage to vegetables and fruit in the vicinity of Chatham.

At Welland the frost is supposed to have killed nearly all the small fruits. Grapes, pears and peaches are badly damaged, also the apple crop, all garden stuff and grain that was far enough advanced has been destroyed.
