BRITAIN URGES UPON FRANCE DRASTIC ACTION

Points Out Insufficiency of the Neutral Zone in Upper Silesia.

LONDON, June 9.—Great Britain is now urging on France the insufficiency of the neutral zone in Upper Silesia and

the necessity of re-establishment of the authority of the control commission throughout the entire area. This would involve pushing back the Poles on an extensive front, which has already been begun by the British forces, and of making a slight adjustment of the German line.

Logical Sequence

This proposed action against the Polish insurgents, it was stated today in official circles, is the logical sequence to the ultimatum sent to Germany demanding the halt and withdrawal of the troops of General von Hoefler, leader of the German defence forces. It was reported yesterday that Germany had acquiesced in this demand.

Government officials today held that since the allies sent their ultimatum to General von Hoefler they are duty bound to take some drastic action toward the Poles, in which it is hoped that France will co-operate.

DRUGGIST KEPT STORE OPEN TOO LONG, IS CHARGED

L. S. Haight Alleged To Have Sold Ice Cream After Hours.

TRAIN IS DISCONTINUED

Michigan Central Takes "Curtis Street Special" Off the Schedule.

ST. THOMAS, June 9.—A charge, not appearing on the police calendar for years, that of keeping one's business premises open after the hours prescribed by the local ordinance, was preferred today against L. S. Haight, proprietor of a drug store on Tabbot street. Complaint was made to the city solicitor of Mr. Haight's alleged violation of the bylaw, and coming before the magistrate, the hearing was adjourned for a week. Mr. Haight, after moving to more enlarged quarters, installed an ice cream section, and served his customers after what is understood as "business hours." The accused acknowledged keeping his store open beyond the customary business period, but Mr. Haight claims that he cannot be prohibited from conducting an ice cream service during the hours allowed the proprietors of similar centers of entertainment.

The question has been put by other commercial concerns, if they placed a soft drink fountain or an ice cream dispensing department in their stores, would they be liable to a penalty under the bylaw if they admitted people to transact one or the other of the subsidiary undertakings, while at the same time they might be pricing a pair of ice cream pants or lemonade shirts.

Express Train Discontinued.

"The Curtis Street Special," a business express run over the Michigan Central in connection with another express train has been temporarily discontinued.

To Open Cheese Factory.

Owing to the rising price of milk at the condensed factories in the district the Lakeview Cheese and Butter Company will open its cheese factory, and has engaged a cheesemaker.

The new Presbyterian Church at Dutton will be opened July 10.

NEW GARAGE BEING ERECTED

The Car Owners' Garage Company, Limited, which recently purchased the Cowan property on York street, have awarded the contract to R. G. Wilson & Son for the erection of a substantial brick building 110x147 feet, which for the most part will be two stories high and will join up with the three-story building now located on the rear of the west half of the site. The plans call for a model garage, with a storage capacity alone of over 50 cars, and will also allow for spacious departments throughout. Many of the structural features are entirely new to London, and contain ideas, that when carried out, will assure efficiency and economical service.

The company have also garages operating at Port Burwell and Aylmer at present, and will continue the proposed system throughout Ontario as the demand warrants.

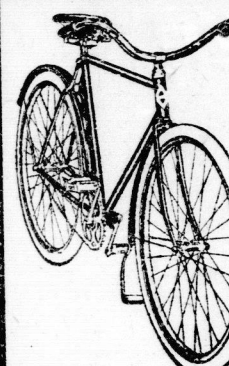
