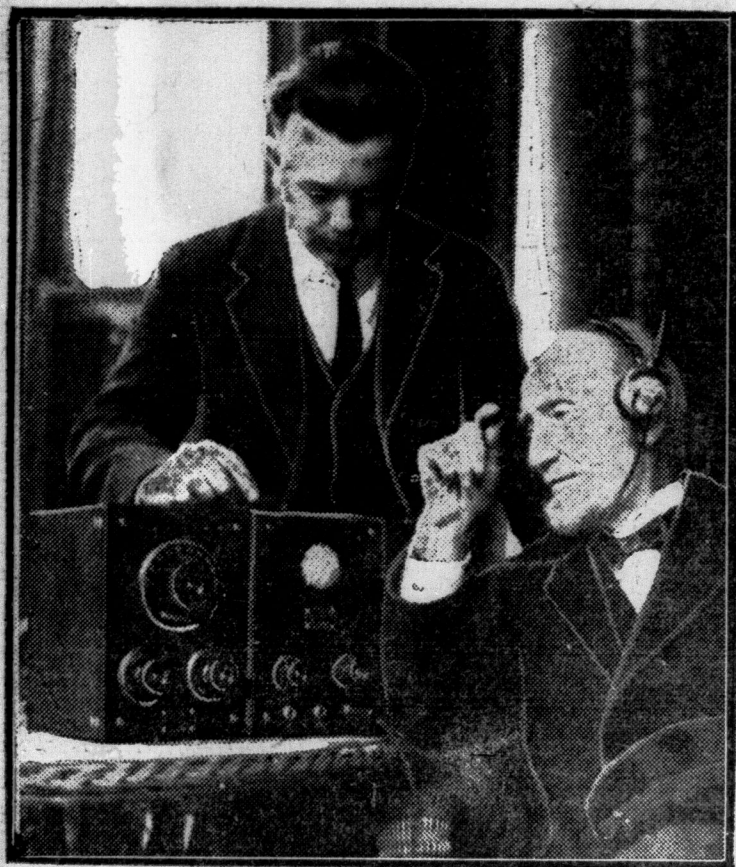

Douglas Fairbanks, Jr., who is being trained for the movies.



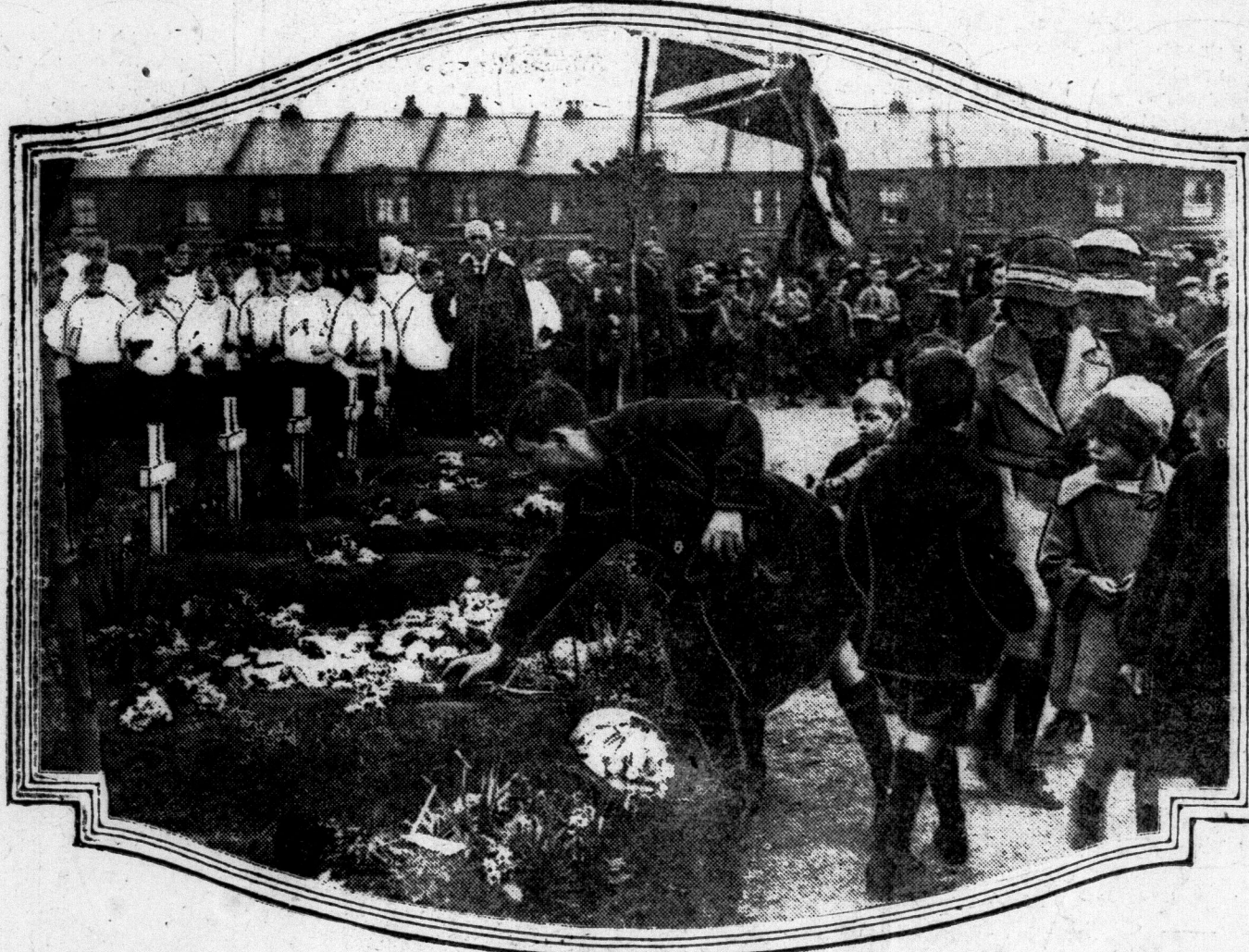

Miss Theresa Bonney, an American artist posing as Mona Lisa and showing a remarkable resemblance to the famous painting.



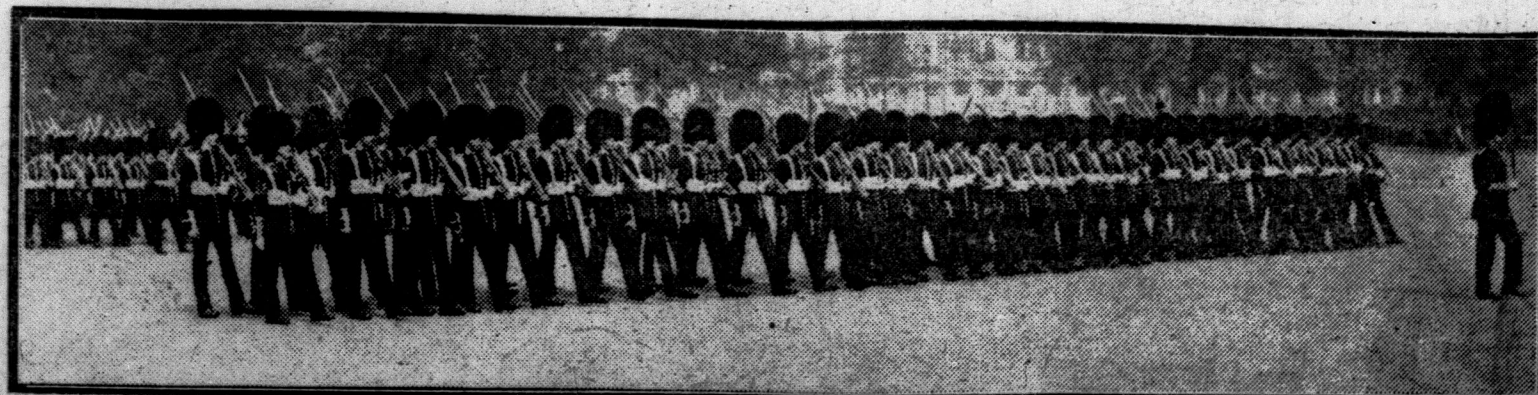
A fine war memorial, the work of Wm. Marsden, the British sculptor.
