## BOARD WILL PAY \$1,000 TO DR. WEIR FOR LONG SERVICE

Members Decide To Delay  
Question of Survey Under  
Dr. Brittain.

### FAVOR APPOINTMENT

As a token of their appreciation of his work on behalf of the educational system in London and on behalf of the children of the city, and also in recognition of more than a quarter of a century of faithful service as an officer of the London board of education, Dr. George S. Weir, late attendance officer, was given an honorarium of \$1,000 last night at a meeting of the full board.

There was no discussion on the recommendation of the special committee appointed to deal with the matter of the doctor's superannuation allowance, and the proposal to give him a lump sum of \$1,000 was agreed to by the board in less than a minute.

In this connection it is understood that a proposal of an annual allowance of \$500 was made to the doctor, but he was also asked to

peruse the assessment rolls while drawing this sum. Doctor Weir preferred to be free to follow his fancies after this long period of service, and said that a lump sum would be more acceptable to him, with the result that followed in today's meeting of the board.

### Explains Survey.

Colonel W. J. Brown, secretary of the local branch of the Citizens' Research Institute of Canada, in a short address to the board, explained the survey which it is proposed to make, and outlined the nature of the work that has been carried out by the institute in other cities. Dr. Horace Brittain of Toronto answered questions of the trustees as to the service his staff were able to offer. They decided to talk the question over and to come to a definite agreement and communicate with Colonel Brown in due course.

All the recommendations of No. 3 committee as to the appointments of teachers at the Central Collegiate, which were made some days ago, were approved by the board with little discussion. They congratulated the committee on the high qualifications of the men secured by Mr. Miller.

A communication from No. 1 committee of the city council asking for quarterly financial statements from the board showing their commitments

and standing brought considerable discussion from the trustees. The secretary was instructed to give all information to which the council had a right.

### Lacks Bookkeeper.

Secretary Tanner in answer to a question stated that the work should be done in his office, but that there was no adequate staff and no bookkeeper. He asked for a committee to look into the question, and was told that perhaps the Research Institute, when and if they started their labors, might find some solution.

The request of William Buchanan, who supplied the board last year with coal, and who fulfilled his contract, in spite of a loss of one dollar per ton, owing to the strike, and who asked the board to meet this loss, some \$1,800, was referred to No. 2 committee. The board is paying about \$6,000 more for their coal this year than last.

The board agreed to protect the workmen in their employment under the

workmen's compensation act. This will mean a yearly premium of about \$144, but it was agreed by the board that in view of the fact that they are at present responsible for their workmen's compensation, it would be good business to use the protection afforded by the act.

### Will Secure Inspector.

Mrs. Hunt wished to know why the advisory vocational committee had decided that the erection of the new addition to the Technical School did not need the service of a supervisor while in the process of building. Trustee Fred Lawson, agreeing with Mrs. Hunt, moved that a supervisor for the building be appointed, and this was carried unanimously.

About 9,500 square feet of slate will be needed by London schools up until the end of 1924. The slate can be bought in carload lots at a price that will effect a saving of \$500 in the board, and they instructed the architect to arrange for the purchase of this amount. Inspector Greer and the architect will be the judges of the quality of the slate. The price

quoted was from 49 to 55 cents per pound, and the carload runs at 5,000 pounds. Another advantage of buying in large quantities was stated to be greater uniformity in the quality of the slate. The traveling expenses of the various officials of the board were subjected to some discussion at the close of the meeting, and may be brought up at another meeting.
