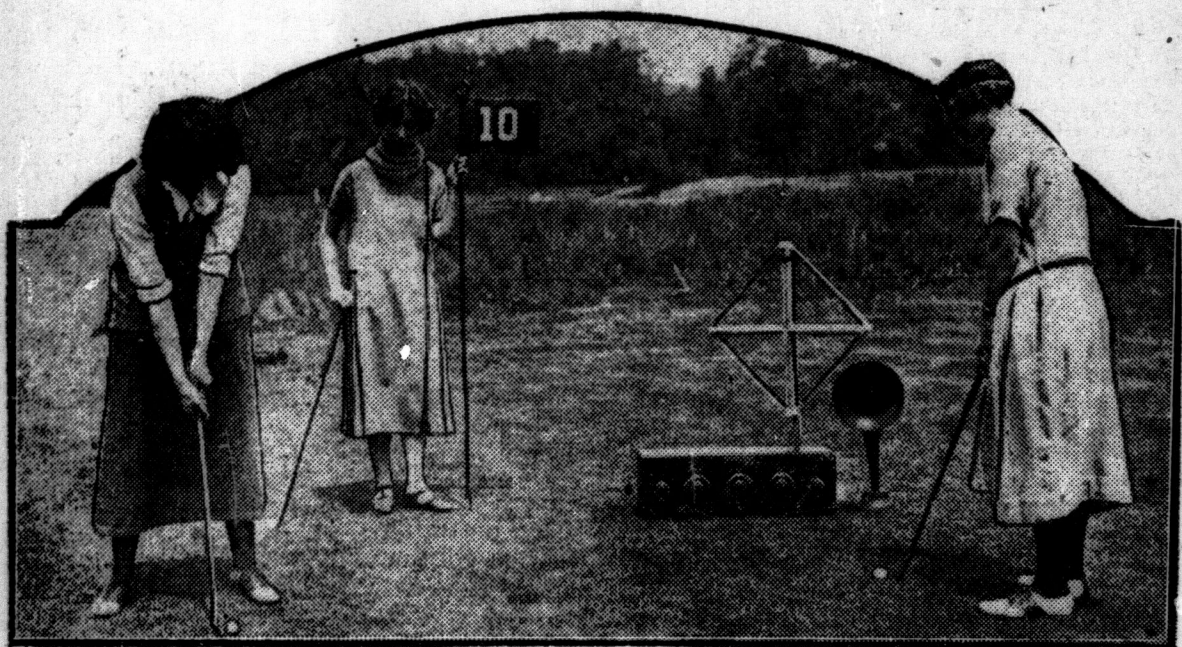

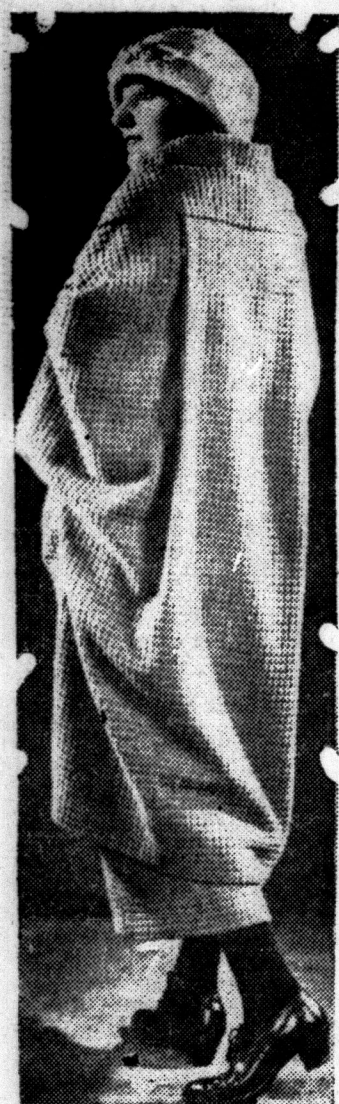
These golf enthusiasts are faithfully carrying out instructions on how to play the game correctly, given by an expert in one of the American broadcasting stations



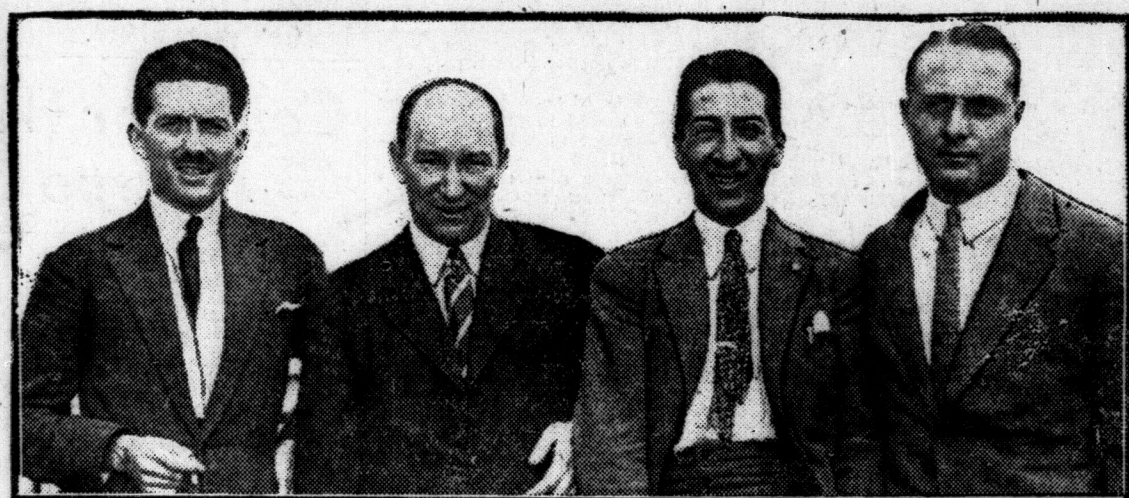

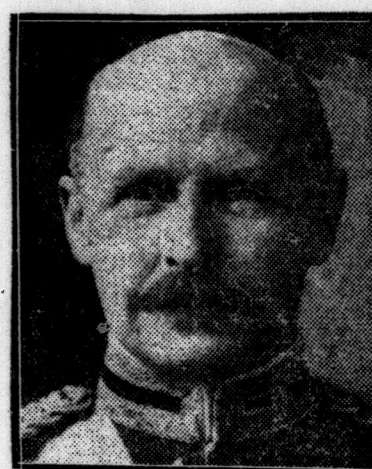
Members of the O.T.C. from Harrow have a bit of fun tossing one of their members up in a blanket in the public schoolboys' cadet camp at Tidworth Penings



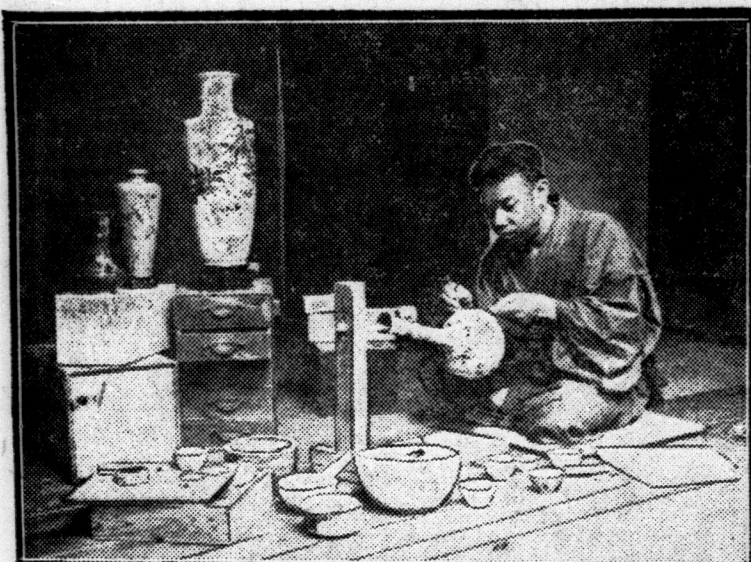
New York fashion experts favor this latest style of dolman for autumn wear. It is made of tan box-embossed chinchilla



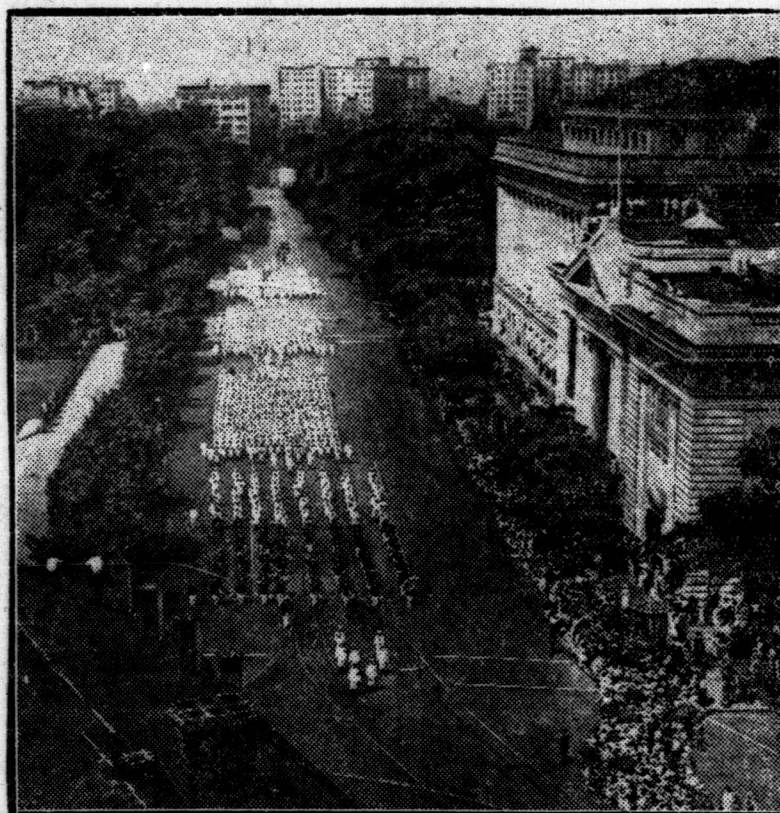

A cloisonne worker in picturesque Japan. The artist covers the vase with a network of copper, filling in the open spaces with enamel paste



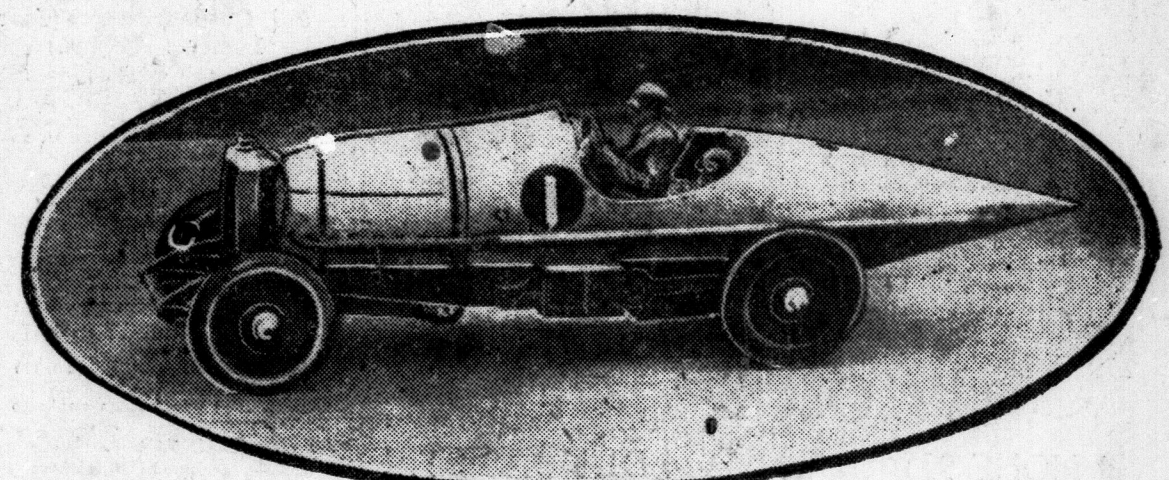
One of the most impressive scenes ever witnessed at Washington was the long procession escorting the mortal remains of President Harding to the capitol

Francis B. Sayre, Harvard professor and son-in-law of Woodrow Wilson, has been appointed legal adviser to the king of Siam



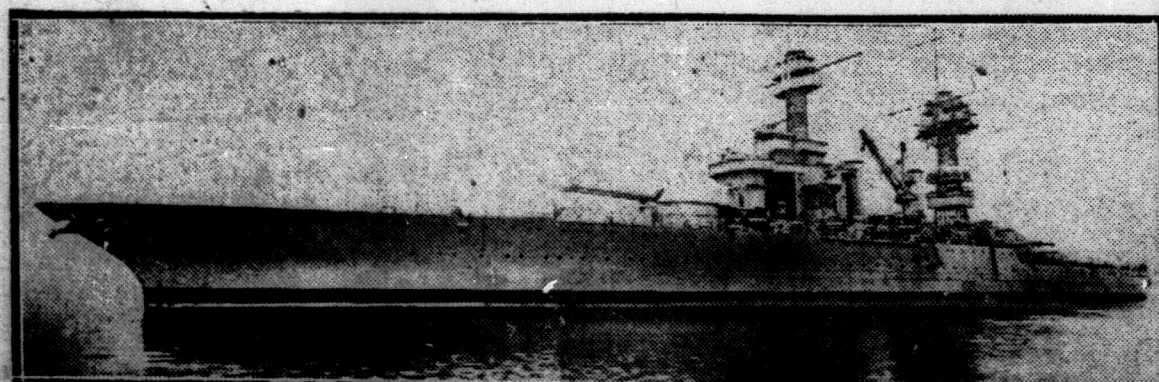

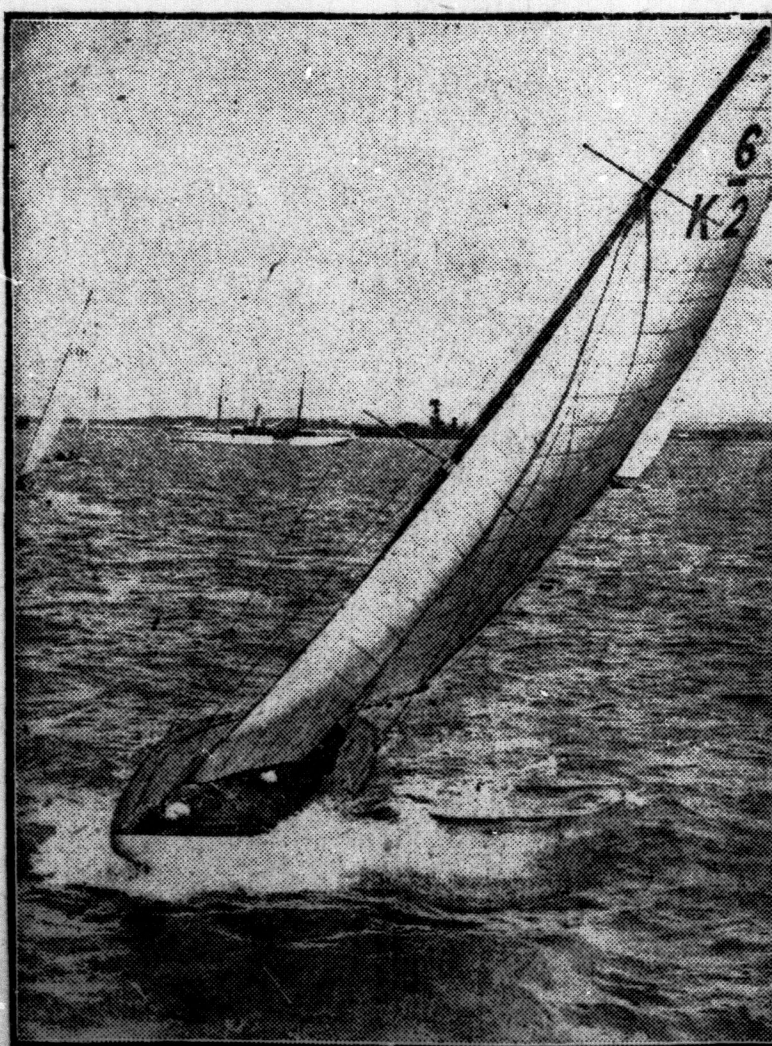
