They include a recommendation for the construction of trunk roads runfor the construction of trunk roads running east and west and north and south through the island, connecting coast points, and so facilitating transportation. Another suggestion is the advisability of placing adequate signposts

at all cross roads. The provincial gov-ernment is urged to appoint a qualified road supervisor for all districts now without the services of such a supervisor, who, in conjunction with the residents of each locality shall lay out plans for all projected roads, and exert 2, J.
