Exports To U. S. From This District Show Increase Of Over One Million

LARGEST INCREASE OVER 1922 SHOWN IN LUMBER AND WOOD PRODUCTS

Figures include Exports Invoiced Through Consulate Here And Agencies at Bathurst And Gaspe.

A comparative statement of the exports of the United States district through the Consulate here during the years of 1922-1923 received from Mr. G. G. Woodward yesterday shows an increase in total value of \$1,000,000 for the year just ended.
