Watford to Have a Free Course in Fruit Growing.

The District Representative has been holding courses and classes on the various branches of farm practice in several places during the winter. Classes have been held at Inwood, Brigden and Petrolea. During the present week a five days' course devoted wholly to fruit-growing is being held at Forest.

A similar course will be held at Watford in the Music Hall from March 5—8. This course is intended to be especially for the benefit of Fruit Growers in the vicinity of Watford and will deal with the special problems of the district. In these days of profitable prices for

The gravity of the present situation in regard to the coming seeding time cannot be too often or too strongly criticised. Unless plump, well matured seed is sown satisfactory crop returns cannot be obtained; and in many parts of Ontario plump and well matured seed is practically non-existent. In all such localities immediate provision should be made for obtaining supplies from quarters in which satisfactory seed is obtainable. The situation is particularly serious in the matter of clover and alfalfa seed. The red clover seed crop of Ontario was exceptionally short last year and supplies are being brought in from abroad to make up for the defficiency.

Do Things Well.

After all they do some things pretty well in Germany even if they do get excited about Great Britain at times, and cause Great Britain to get excited in return. A writer Corrected Quickly by the Use of points out that long ago the Germans solved the problem of utilizing their road sides. They plant fruit-bearing trees along the highway and protect them. These trees not only serve the purpose of affording shade, but they are a source of profit to the community. The fruits are gathered and sold and, the proceeds go to a fund which is used for maintaining the roads. Thus the roads are rendered to some extent self-supporters, and the tax-payer is relieved of a portion of his burden. The strangest part of the story is that the fruit is seldom stolen, except by foreigners, and the trees seldom injured.

One can imagine what the result would be if the highways of Canada were lined with fruit trees. It is to be feared that little of the proceeds from the sale of the fruit would go into the road-building fund, for the reason that but little of the fruit would be left to be gathered. Not only that, but the trees would be destroyed in the efforts to get the fruit. Has the average Canadian a less highly developed sense of personal honesty and of public duty and responsibility than the average Ger-

man? Maybe not, but the average Canadian has not been so carefully trained in the application of his notions of honesty to the duties of citizenship.
