principal actors are drawn from life; and the aim of the book has been to keep strictly within not only the possible but the actual, without the least exaggeration.

The lessons of a book of narrative interest, which gives as this book does, vivid impressions of the scenes describe and characters portrayed, are much more forcibly fixed upon the mind than those conveyed by a book of didactic counsel. I, therefore, heartily commend this volume for Sunday school and family use, with the prayer that, by the blessing of God, its important teachings may be so indelible engraved upon their hearts, that they sow not to the wind lest they reap the whirlwind.
