and fed them entirely upon cotton-seed, and what they could pick upou the rough pastures. They ate two pints a day, and did well on it, 31 ewes rearing 45 lambs, some of which dressed 60 lbs. in the month of june.

I gather from the Ontario Agricultural Commissiou's Report that 95 per cent. of the bones grown in this country are exported! only 5 per cent are retained. No wonder our pastures degenerate. The following is an analysis of the superphosphate made by Messrs Lamb & Co., Toronto.






