From THOS. WHITTAKER, Bible House, New York:

Family Prayers for the Christian Year, arranged by Rev. W. A. Snively, D.D., a very useful compilation for "the Priest of the Household," based upon the Prayer Book of the Church; cloth, red edges, 60.

Royal Helps for Loyal Living, compiled by Martha Wallace Richardson—beautifully bound; cloth, red edges, and containing a verse of Scripture for every day in the year, with short appropriate selections, poetical and prose, from leading authors. It appears to us excellent and helpful; less so for Church people than others, as not observing the Church year.

The Treasures in the Marshes by Charlotte M. Yonge; a very pretty story suitable for boys and enforcing the duty and advantages of honesty and upright dealing, and the danger of deceit and dishonesty. Churchly in character and well suited for Sunday-school libraries; cloth, pp. 191; \$1.00.

The Vicar of Maverston, by S. Baring Gould, M.A., is No. 2 of Whitaker's Library of Church Teaching and Defence, now being published monthly by this enterprising house, under a yearly subscription price of \$3. The books are issued in paper covers; printed in good clear type on good paper, much ahead of the ordinary 50c book. Single volumes may be had at prices named; this at 50c. The list includes most excellent works and this effort to meet the demand for cheap literature with good reading matter deserves encouragement.

The Social Law of God, by the late Rev. E. A. Washburn, D.D., Rector of Calvary church, N.Y., being the 5th volume of the series above named, uniform in size and style; paper 212; 50c. These sermons commanded wide attention when first published and received the warmest commendation from all quarters. Its aim is to show the harmony between the old and the new dispensations.
