

AMBASSADORS AND HIGH COMMISSIONERS POSTED ABROAD

Libya: Claude T. Charland as Ambassador. Mr. Charland joined the Department of Trade and Commerce in 1957. He has served abroad in New Orleans, Lagos, Sao Paulo, Brussels and Paris. He was Ambassador to Mexico and since 1985 he has been Ambassador to Italy.

Melbourne: Robert M. Dawson as Consul General. Mr. Dawson joined the Trade Commissioner Service, Department of Trade and Commerce, in 1956. He has served abroad in Guatemala, Manila, Madrid, and as Consul and Trade Commissioner in San Francisco. Since 1981, he has been Deputy Commissioner General, Expo '86.

Poland: E.J. Bergbusch as Ambassador. Mr. Bergbusch joined the Department of External Affairs in 1961. He has served abroad in Tel Aviv, Geneva, and as High Commissioner to Tanzania. Since 1985, he has been Chairman, Southern Africa Task Force.

Sao Paulo: Normand Villeneuve, as Consul General. Mr. Villeneuve joined the Department of Trade and Commerce in 1966. He has served abroad in Melbourne, Brussels, Dublin, and as Counsellor (Commercial) in Algiers, Counsellor (Commercial) in Washington. Since 1984, he has been Counsellor (Commercial and Economic) in Brasilia.

Singapore: Sean Brady as High Commissioner. Mr. Brady joined the Department of External Affairs in 1970. He has served abroad in Hong Kong, Bangkok and New York. Since 1984, he has been the Official Spokesman of the Department of External Affairs.

Sri Lanka: Carolyn M. McAskie as High Commissioner. Ms. McAskie joined the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) in 1968. She has served abroad in Nairobi, and as Assistant Director at the Commonwealth Secretariat in London. Since 1984, she has been Director General, Multilateral Technical Co-operation.
