The position is the same at the present time. If the minister wishes to make an intervention, he may do so.

Mr. Lang: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, for giving me this opportunity. I am glad to say that the Canadian Wheat Board will make every effort to ensure that the supplies which are required are available. There will be some difficult transportation problems this winter, and it will be important for everyone involved in the business of obtaining feed grains to do what they ought to do to get those grains and not rely on the help of the Wheat Board. However, when the chips are down and it is a matter of supplies, the position of the domestic market is, of course, held secure first.
