He was quite happy coming down on Monday morning largely because he would be so much nearer to us here than in Ottawa. I was down to have a look at him yesterday and he appears to be very well. The reports from the attending physicians are also satisfactory. Abnormal temperature and pulse have gone and apparently it is but a mild attack. One dreads the after effects of scarlet fever much more than the fever itself. I am sorry to say that Lady Currie has been laid up ever since we came home. She had, as you know, a bit of a cold last Sunday and the worry about Garner has knocked her completely out. Garner has been ill so much that I think she almost despairs of his ever being real well. I am taking them home with me tonight and hope to get a chance to read them, which I promise to do carefully.
