The Toronto staff is larger than ours in aggregate number. The number of Professors is the same. The difference is in the large number of lecturers and teaching Fellows. This is the case of Toronto the advantage of permitting more subjects to be taught in small classes, but the disadvantage of committing much of the teaching to teachers of immature minds and small experience.

The expense of the Toronto staff is much greater than that of McGill. The salaries of Professors are somewhat larger, the maximum being \$3,200, and the Tutors and Lecturers receive from \$500 to \$1,000 each per annum. There are also some attendants, &c. not mentioned above.
