## LICENSES

Non-residents must pay a license of \$25 to hunt deer to the Clerk of the County in which he proposes to camp. Fee for license for residents, 75 cents.

## STATE OF WISCONSIN

## (OPEN SEASON)

GAME.—Deer, from November 2nd to November 19th. Deer in counties of Sheboygan and Fond du Lac protected until April 10th, 1992. Not more than two may be killed by one man in one season.

Dogs must not be used to hunt deer.

Rabbits, otter, fisher and marten, October 2nd to April 30th.

Woodcock, partridge, pheasant, prairie chicken, or prairie hen, grouse of all kinds, plover, snipe, September 2nd to November 30th.

Wild duck, or brant, or any aquatic fowl (including snipe), excepting wild geese, September 2nd to December 31st.

· Wild geese, from September 2nd to April 30th.

Swan, perpetually protected. Insectivorous birds always protected.

Mongolian, Chinese or English pheasants, and quail of all varieti s, protected until September, 1901.

FISH.-Trout, all varieties, April 16th to August 31st.

Black, yellow and Oswego bass, May 26th to February 28th, except in certain counties.

## LICENSES

Residents, \$1.00; Non-residents, for deer, and all other game (not protected), \$25.00; all game (not protected), except deer, \$10.00.
