Like Michael Angelo we must see the angel in the marble. Like Jesus Christ we must discover the thing that might be in the thing that is. And unless we are to be given over to a hopeless pessimism, unless we believe that we are fighting a losing game, unless we purpose to quit the field and surrender the spoils to the devil, we
