SUGAR TRUST INDICTED UNDER SHERMAN LAW

It is Able, the Government Alleges, to Fix Prices Arbitrarily—Fraudulent Methods Charged. NEW YORK, Nov. 28.—The federal government to-day began one of its most important actions against great corporations, which are said to have violated the Sherman anti-trust law. Henry A. Wise, U. S. district attorney, filed in the U. S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, a petition asking for the dissolution of the American Sugar Refining Company, and 29 other corporations, which compose the so-called sugar trust.

OPPOSITION REMODEL THEIR COMMITTEES

The postoffice committee was organized to-day under the chairmanship of J. E. Armstrong, of East Lambton. He is recognized as the chief authority on postoffice matters on the opposition side of the house.

MINING CATASTROPHE

Five Men Blown to Fragments and 9 Others Entombed by Explosion. DURANT, Okla., Nov. 28.—Five men were blown to atoms and nine others were entombed beyond hope of rescue by a gas explosion in the mine of the Choctaw Asphalt Co. at Jumbo, near Antlers, Oklahoma, to-day.

Wife Desertion on the Increase

Two sessions of the Baptist Sabbath School Board were held yesterday, to consider the appointment of a successor to Rev. B. W. Merrill, former travelling secretary. Several names were considered, and an appointment is likely to be made by the executive in the course of the week.

ON TRIAL FOR MURDER

French Canadian Girl of 17 Accused of Death of Employer. CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Nov. 28.—A girl just past her seventeenth year, Estelle Le Blanc, will be tried in the Middlesex County Superior Criminal Court here this week for the murder at Waltham, Nov. 20, 1909, of her employer, Clarence E. Glover. The little French-Canadian girl is the youngest of her sex ever tried for first degree murder in the annals of New England courts.
