allow the union to adopt its own schedule. Delegate Hungerford, provoked a vigorous language used in the resolution towards the commissioners, but the resolution carried and the committee will wait on Hon. Mr. Hanna next week.

Another resolution asks an amendment to the Assessment Act, whereby all assessing of land within the city's limits as far as land would be abolished. At present blocks of vacant land of two acres or more in extent are so assessed. This reform will also be urged upon the provincial secretary.

The application of the Canadian Society of Civil Engineers for a charter of incorporation to the exclusion from engineering work of all save members was disapproved by the meeting, the favoring of close corporation methods, and the Dominion government will be asked to disallow the application.

Allan Stedholme, M.L.A., made a vigorous speech at the close, reviewing the great improvements in the working conditions in British mines and factories.
