Washington, Nov. 11.—Statistician Hyde of the Agriculture Department has completed the official report of the crop of the world for this month, and a revised review of the world's wheat is an important feature. The somewhat complete victory of the Republicans freed financial circles of the fear of another silver agitation, and there was an immediate rush to buy stocks on both forcign and domestic accounts. Together with what may virtually be called the success of sound money, have come such good influences as a lifting of the European war cloud, easier money markets in New York and ancreasing railway earnings. All these buoyant features have come forward in a bunch, and the result has been strongly advancing prices, little affected even by heavy profit-taking in some quarters. Granger and Southern Railway stocks have shown particular strength on larger traffic returns.
