"Champagne was drunk in honor of the terrible event at the moment when others were vaguely inquiring of one another what had happened. Bresmes' name was mentioned before the American Court of Inquiry, but not sufficient evidence was then forthcoming to warrunt any action, and all reference to him was suppressed in the published report. The Cubans here almost without exception regard the charges of El Reconcentrado as beyond dispute. Bresmes is now said to be hiding in Spain."

THE DEEP WATERWAYS.

Report of the Board of Engineers Presented to Congress. Washington, Jan. 4.-The Board of Enneers on Deep Waterways on Nov. 30 sineers on Deep Waterways on Nov. 30 submitted to the Secretary of War a report which was to-day presented to Congress.
