The best matter how perfectly it is cooked or how well it is served, it is to all intents and purposes a failure if it is not carved. The housekeeper's rules are as follows:

**Roast Turkey.**—The turkey should be carved on a table covered with a white cloth. The carver should stand to the right of the turkey, and the guests to the left. The turkey should be carved in the following order: First, the neck and head, which should be cut off and served on a separate platter. Next, the legs, which should be cut off and served on a separate platter. Then, the breast, which should be cut into slices and served on a separate platter. Finally, the wings, which should be cut off and served on a separate platter.
