WINDSOR MEN PROTEST
AGAINST WILCOX PLAN

Racetrack Deputation Leaves Thursday for Ottawa—Government Got \$52,000 Last Year.

WINDSOR, Jan. 30.—Backed by a petition containing signatures of more than one thousand citizens of Windsor and vicinity, a deputation will leave Windsor Thursday for Ottawa to protest against the plan of Oliver J. Wilcox, M. P. for North West, to amend the criminal code, limiting horse racing in any one district in Canada to fourteen days a year.

Under the present law the three tracks nearest Windsor are closed twice a week, and the plan would allow two seven-day meetings a year, and if Mr. Wilcox's amendment is acted upon favorably, two of the tracks would have to discontinue operations.

Last year the provincial government benefited to the extent of \$52,000 from the license fee of \$1,250 a day paid by each of the tracks near Windsor. Besides, a 5 and 10-cent tax on every admission ticket sold. That Federal government took part of the profit under the plan of Sir Thomas White, minister of finance, to tax the incomes of companies.
