SINN FEIN LEADER BRUTALLY MURDERED

MONTREAL, March 29.—The Montreal Star tonight publishes the following under date of Dublin: Thomas Dwyer was called from his home at Thurles early today by an armed party, and was shot to death. The circumstances of Dwyer's murder were almost identical with those in the murder of James McCarthy, Sinn Fein leader, who was shot and killed in the bedroom of his home at Thurles, Saturday.

The Dwyer murder was believed another proof of the belief here that two rival murder societies were warring upon sympathizers of Sinn Fein, and the British Government throughout Ireland.

Police today "shot-up" the village of Regre, near Thurles, according to a dispatch here. The police left their barracks and marched through the streets firing their rifles, it was said. Villagers were terrified. It was believed the shooting was in revenge for the recent murder of a policeman.

MINE WORKERS TO BALLOT ON PROPOSAL

LONDON, March 29.—The mine workers' delegates, in conference here, decided today upon a ballot of the men as to whether the Government's offer of a twenty per cent increase on gross earnings should be accepted or a strike called for the three shillings minimum increase demanded.

This decision was arrived at after consideration of the Government's new proposal of a twenty per cent increase on gross earnings, with a minimum flat advance of two shillings for all workers over 18 years of age; one shilling for workers between 16 and 18 years, and nine pence for workers under 16 years.

INGERSOLL LADY DEAD.

INGERSOLL, March 29.—Death has claimed another well-known resident in the person of Naomi Harris, aged 63, who passed away at her residence. Under the auspices of the Citizens' Band a pleasing concert was held in the town hall tonight. There was a good attendance.

MIDDLESEX DELEGATES PROTEST AGAINST SELECTED ROUTE FOR NORTHERN PROVINCIAL HIGHWAY

"Fourth Line" Road Favored Over Sarnia Gravel Road Route—Would Touch More Towns, Be Nearer Railways and Three Miles Shorter—Highway Should Take Straightest Line Between Sarnia and London, Declare Speakers.

STRATHROY, March 29.—In protest against the designated route of the northern provincial highway, which will carry it from Stratford via St. Marys, Elginfield and the Sarnia gravel road to Sarnia, 50 delegates representing many points in the county of Middlesex, met in the armories here this afternoon. The meeting was almost unanimous in the belief that the highway should run by the most direct route from Sarnia through London.

Although considerable, and at times heated, discussion took place during which the question was debated from every angle, it was generally conceded that as London is the pivot point in the affairs of Western Ontario and is the great distribution point all roads should lead there. The route west of Stratroy is the fly in the ointment of a peaceful settlement. Some of the delegates favored the Sarnia gravel road, the designated route of the highway in this part of the country, but a big majority believed it should be built over the Fourth Line road which runs parallel to the Sarnia gravel road, but from three to four miles south of it. It was also pointed out that this route was shorter by about three miles, runs closer to the railways, and serves many towns such as Stratroy, Watford and Kerwood, while the Sarnia gravel road, it was claimed, serves nothing but Sarnia.

The meeting was opened by L. H. Dampier, mayor of Stratroy, who was elected chairman. Mr. McIntyre, secretary of the local chamber of commerce, was appointed secretary.

Several factions. Charles Talbot, county engineer, opened the discussion. He said that there were several factions working to get the road run through that territory where they lived, so that it would serve their individual needs. He outlined the proposed route of the road from Sarnia along the Sarnia gravel road to a point three miles north of Stratroy, where it branches off and thence across the road and Lebo and then through Elginfield to St. Marys, and then to Stratroy. It would pass some eighteen miles north of London. Part of this road was extremely objectionable, as it was full of quagmires and ran over some bad hills. People in Middlesex would be better off if there was no east and west traffic on the latter part of this road, never had been any, and it is not likely to be established. London was the objective of the people in Port Huron, Sarnia and other places in the surrounding country.

John Stuart, county clerk, said he was in Toronto when the minister had designated the route. He had thought it a mistake when they proposed to leave the Sarnia gravel road to cut to Elginfield. He considered that such a road should follow the lines of traffic and go where the people need it. He was not in favor of the present plan, and thought that it should be condemned.

Follow Shorter Route. Richard Oke said the Government could make or unmake roads, but that the traffic would always follow the shortest and best-defined route. He thought that the road that should be built over the Fourth Line road, rather than the gravel road, it would, he claimed, be shorter, and therefore cheaper to construct. It served the greatest number of towns, and would prove a great accommodation to travelers. He felt that as Stratroy was one of the best towns in Western Ontario and in the center of the best district it should be on the road.

"The Government," he said, "must be taught that they cannot play politics with such a matter, but that they must serve the people." Reeve Johnston of Watford strongly favored the "Fourth Line" because of the number of towns it served, and its proximity to the railways would serve the motorists to the greatest advantage. Reeve Wilson of Wyoming was of the same belief.

Angus McLeish of East Williams said the proposed route would not benefit East Williams, and declared it "one of the crookedest in the country." He felt that the Sarnia gravel road would give the most benefit and would be the cheapest to build.

Best for Country. John Curry, ex-woman of the county, said he was in conversation with Mr. Biggs after the road had been designated.

PRINCE AT PANAMA

PANAMA, March 29.—The Prince of Wales is expected to arrive at Cristobal aboard the British Cruiser Renown at 6:30 o'clock tomorrow morning. After a salute of twenty-one guns, the prince will be received by A. F. Bennett, British minister at Panama, with his staff and Commander Sergeant, superintendent of the Panama Canal Board. TALK MAY REVOLT

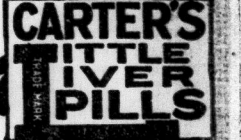
