

## ONLY TWO HORSES WERE LEFT FRIDAY AT HAMILTON

### Moonraker Defeats Glimmer and Green Seal Beats Cave Adsum.

The patrons of the Hamilton spring meeting were favored with fine weather on the fourth day, when a good card of six races were run off, the feature being the Walker Cup for steeplechasers over a distance of two miles. In this only four went to the post, with Allan Case's Steve Lane the odds-on choice at three to five. It was as usual and the first choices were bowled over one after the other for the first three races. Favorite moonraker are having a rough time of it at this meeting, for only four have won since opening day. The special train from Toronto brought up over a hundred, while the local race followers turned out in full force.

When the bugle sounded for the first race a fair lot of spectators responded to the call and Joe Galtens the favorite to eight to five. The play in this was on Personal, who did not finish in the money. When the gate opened Personal was rushed to the front and set the pace to the top of the stretch, where she threw well up. Moonraker, who had never taken any chances and made every post a winning one. He won handsily, but running an improved race over his last time out, when he had a stable boy up. Glimmer was slow to get going and could never overhaul the gap opened up in the first half mile by Moonraker. Canine Maid came with a rush at the end and was easily third. The Globe pulled up lame.

The third race was a good bunch of two-year-old maidens go to the post, with Beau Nash, a recent purchase by the Kirkfield stable, the choice. In the fourth race, the play was all on this horse, while the winner was not even in this event. The choice was the stable of W. G. Wilson. Steve Lane was the odds-on choice at three to five when one to ten would have been a good price. He went to the front when the race was over and was always ready and won by three lengths. The up-and-coming Andrew Summers was batted hard, but the other two fell. They were remounted and ridden over the course, but owing to tired money given. This was one of the poorest races that have ever been run for this stake.

The fifth race saw another first choice go to the wall when Cave Adsum, a well touted first choice, was never able to catch the fleet-footed Green Seal, who tipped her field and won by three lengths. Cave Adsum outran Strommond and Dark Night in the last eighth of a mile. Only three started in the late race, with Juggler the odds-on choice. Woolly Seal went to the front and made all the running to the top of the stretch, where Juggler came away and won with plenty in reserve. Elicott, who was nodding on the way to the post, broke down.
