## The Week's Market

## PEEL FARMER CREATES EXCITEMENT IN COURT

Charged Constable With Perjury and the Magistrate and Crown Attorney With Conspiracy.

BRAMPTON, Dec. 10.—(Special.)—Serious accusations against several magistrates and officials of Peel County were made today by John E. Titchmarsh, prosecutor in the perjury case against County Constable McCannell of Inglewood, which was opened this morning in the Brampton court house before Police Magistrate Crawford.

Titchmarsh openly charged the magistrate with "corruptly and collusively conspiring with the crown attorney, W. H. McFadden, to delay the issuing process thru information sworn to by the police magistrate on July 5, 1909, until Dec. 4, 1909." He objected to the "locus standi" of Magistrate Crawford on the ground that as he was treasurer of the County of Peel, he was disqualified from acting as magistrate. Titchmarsh further denounced Crown Attorney McFadden as having conspired with crown documents in the case of Rex vs. Titchmarsh.

Magistrate Crawford, however, proceeded with the perjury case against Tate McCannell, and after hearing the evidence, decided that the statement

complained of had not been used to deceive the court. He therefore dismissed the case.

## Shipped Out of Court.

It was at a preliminary session, however, in the perjury case of Titchmarsh, prosecutor, vs. David Graham, J.P., of Peel County, that a climax was reached. The magistrate was on the bench, the lawyers were ready to begin their arguments, and all the witnesses were present, for both crown and defendant. The witness was called—J. E. Titchmarsh, but he was nowhere to be found. Without any warning Titchmarsh had quietly slipped out of the court room during the preliminaries and he was discovered half an hour later, quietly admiring the Christmas decorations in a store window uptown. A constable was sent to bring him back to the court room, but Titchmarsh refused to come. Acting Crown Prosecutor Morphy was then asked to have a bench warrant issued for Titchmarsh's arrest, but he refused to do so. Magistrate Crawford thereupon flatly refused to grant an adjournment and dismissed the case. Titchmarsh will lodge an appeal with the attorney-general immediately.

Both Crown Attorney McFadden and Police Magistrate Crawford scolded the idea of any conspiracy having been formed against Titchmarsh. The reason the perjury suits were delayed, said Mr. McFadden to The World, "is because the civil suits which Titchmarsh brought against Magistrate Graham and Constable McCannell were still pending and they had to be disposed of before the perjury charges could be heard."

## The Cause of It.

The circumstances leading up to the present trouble occurred about two years ago, when Titchmarsh, a wealthy farmer, was fined by Magistrate Graham for putting coal-oil in well at Inglewood, from which several farmers got their drinking water. Titchmarsh refused to pay the fine and was committed to Brampton Jail. A few hours later, however, his lawyer, B. F. Juston, paid the fine and the prisoner was released. He then entered suits for false imprisonment against Magistrate Graham and Constable Tate McCannell, claiming that a distress warrant should first have been issued against his goods and chattels. The cases were entered at Osprey Hall, but no trial was deemed advisable, as McCannell denied that he had arrested Titchmarsh. He stated that he had merely walked down with him to Brampton Jail and had him locked up there, nothing more. This statement resulted in Titchmarsh bringing the charge of perjury against the constable. The perjury charge against Magistrate David Graham of Inglewood resulted from an examination he made before J. B. Dixon, registrar at Brampton, on May 15, 1909, and for delay in issuing the summons to have the proceedings carried on.

## M'DERMOTT PLEADS GUILTY

To Uttering Forged Cheque for \$10—Cases in Sessions.

Before Judge Winchester in the court of general sessions yesterday, Joseph M'Dermott pleaded guilty to uttering a forged cheque for \$10, signed by S. B. Latchford. He was remanded for sentence until the end of court and allowed out on bail.

Edward Swan, chauffeur at one time for Charles S. McGinnies, was acquitted of the charge of stealing the latter's automobile.

Wilfrid Long and Lewis Barry, charged with doing bodily harm by furious driving, were found not guilty. The young men, each with a lady, had been driving near Woodbridge on the second of August, and Long collided with Mrs. Clara Kemp, of Woodbridge, who was driving with a friend and pinned them under their buggy, which was over turned.

It was shown that there was no furious driving until one of the young men tried to pass the other. Mrs. Kemp also stated that she did not suffer from any injuries sustained from the accident.

## MR. HALFPENNY ACCEPTS

Coming to Toronto as Secretary of Ontario S.S. Association.

Rev. W. Halpenny, for seven years general secretary of the Indiana Sunday Schools' Association, has accepted the appointment of general secretary of the Ontario Association, and will begin his new duties about the first of the new year. Mr. Halpenny is a Canadian and previous to going to Indianapolis was for two years secretary of the Quebec Association. He will be associated with R. J. F. (Hassford) of Guelph, the field secretary.

## ROAD TO PORCUPINE

T. & N. O. Railway Agrees to Accommodate Prospectors.

MATHEWSON, Dec. 10.—A deputation of Porcupine prospectors and miners interviewed the T. & N. O. Railway Commission at Matheson, and were assured by Messrs. Englehart and Dams that every facility would be offered them for the handling of freight and passengers from that town to the new gold fields. The commission are going to turn the old engine house into a freight shed, capable of holding several cars of freight.

The road is now nearly complete and teams will be driving over this route on Tuesday, the 14th. Over forty men are on it all the time, making a sixteen foot road.

Jack Wilson, superintendent for Mr. Edwards of Chicago, owner of the Golden Pole Mine, has now twenty dogs, making five teams on the route taking in supplies and mail.

## NORTHERN CROWN AT PAR

Block of 255 Shares Sold at 100 on Winnipeg Exchange.

WINNIPEG, Man., Dec. 10.—(Special.)—Northern Crown Bank certificate this morning reached par, one block of 25 being disposed of on the Winnipeg Stock Exchange at 100. This is one of the most notable advances which have taken place in the western securities in recent years. In June last these certificates were quoted at 75, with little demand.

The announcement of an addition to the directorate may have had something to do with the strength of certificates, it having been decided to add three directors, J. H. Ashdown, H. T. Clempson and W. C. Lettlow.

## ROYALTIES TOO HIGH

Mine Owners Ask for Reduction to Ten Per Cent. Flat.

Cobalt mine owners yesterday renewed their appeal for a substantial reduction of Cobalt ore royalties. A committee from the owners waited on the Ontario cabinet, and asked that

While overhauling the belongings of Matt Camp, a Finn employed by the Nipissing Mines, Inspector Calbeck found a quantity of high-grade ore hidden under the mattress. 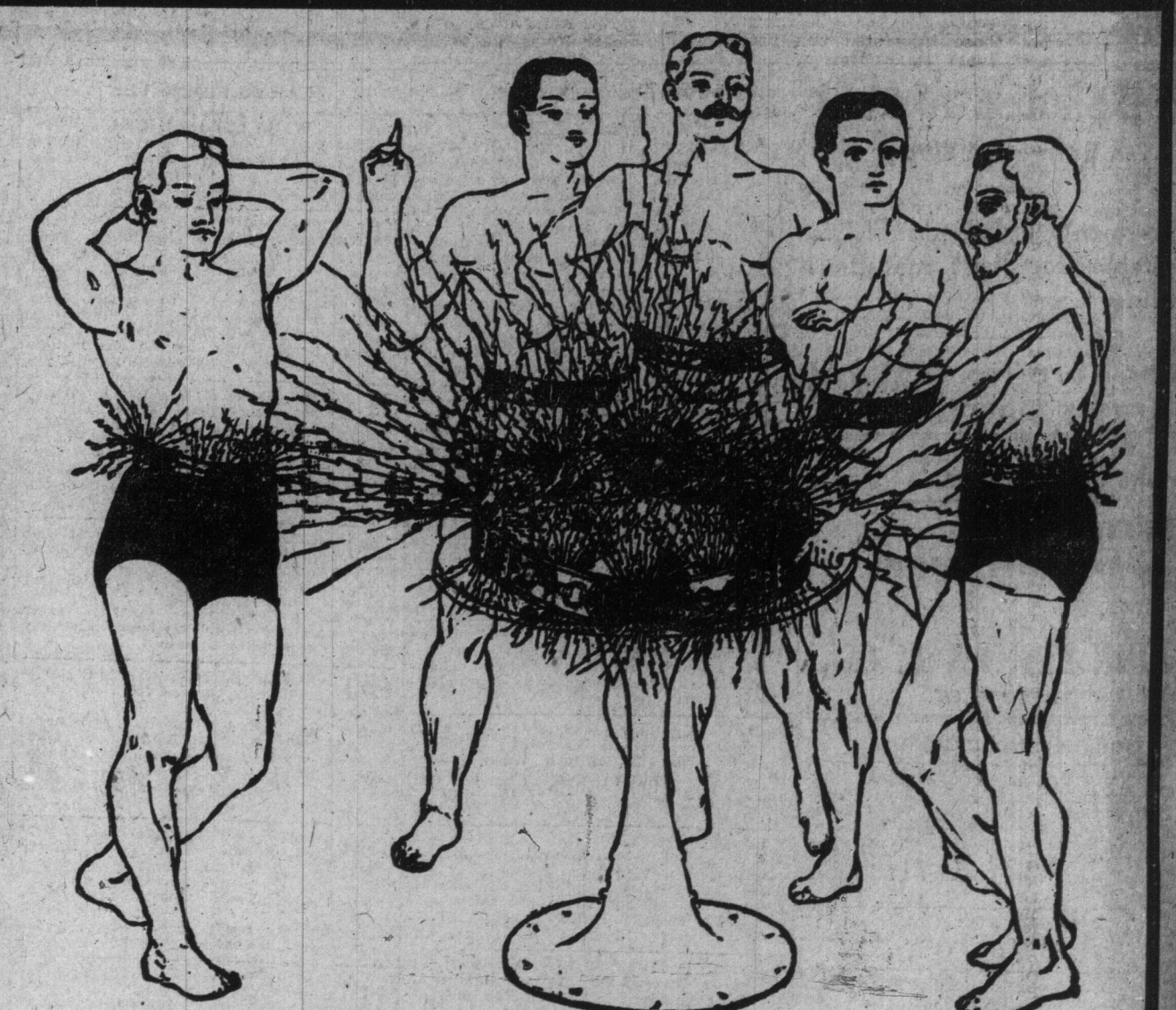
