A Large Increase Over 1805 as Reported From Washington.

Washington, July 3.—The National Bank circulation outstanding July 1, aggregated \$225,912,960, an increase during June of \$712,612, and since June 30, 1895, of \$14,812,262.

HEAVY SWINDLES ALLEGED.

A Boston Tobacco Firm in the Law's Clutches, Charged With France Eunning Into High Figures.

Boston, July 3.-The H. A. Davis Co., heavy dealers in cigars, tobacco, horses, carriages and all kinds of general mercarriages and all kinds of general merchandise, was declared insolvent by the court one day last week, and two members of the firm, Lindsey N. Oliver and Henry A. Davis, both well-known eigar manufacturers, have been placed under arrest by Inspectors Harris and Collins of the Bureau of Criminal Investigation.

It is alleged they have been carrying extensive swindling operations for some time, and that these alleged fraudulent transactions will exceed \$700,000 in Boston and vicinity, while, it is said their peculiar transactions may involve an amount something more than \$1,000,000.

In January of this year H. A. Davis, who for the past 12 years has been engaged in business in Boston, and has enjoyed the entire confidence of those with whom he came in contact, formed the corporation known as the H.A.
