poor, and the discount allowed to benovelent institutions in the purchase of books.

Our Agent, Mr. Thomas M. MacKelvie, has systematically visited the agencies throughout the province during the year, and by frequent correspondence has endeavored to stimulate the friends of the Bible Society to revived exertion on its behalf.

Your committee has recently issued an appeal by circular to the Branches and to the city churches, and hopes for a liberal response. The Committee has lost none of its members during the year, and has added the name of Mr. James E. Barnes. For the measure of success which has attended their operations the members of the Committee record their gratitude.
