#### QUEENSVILLE

Has appointments in Gwillimsbury and amongst the Indians on Georgiana Island. It has a membership of 75 among the whites and 23 amongst the Indians. The progress of Methodism is slow owing to the overrunning of the country by Unitarian principles.

# COLLINGWOOD

Reports 6 appointments and 5 classes, members 55. The mission contains some of the excellent of the earth, and bids fair to become a fine circuit.

# HANOVER.

On this charge are 7 appointments. More than 80 have been converted during the year, of whom 60 have united with our Society. This is a promising field. Missionary money raised during the year, \$75.83.

# CREEMORE

Has a membership of 85. One new appointment has been taken up during the year. God has blessed the labors of the missionary with a gracious revival; converted 45. Prosperity is beginning to dawn on this field.

# MT. FOREST

Has a parsonage and 5 churches. Conversions during the year, 5; mis sionary money raised during the year, \$48.

# INVERMAY

Is in a measurably prosperous state. One parsonage and 2 churches.

# WOLF ISLAND,

Although still continued on the list of missions, is more than self-sustaining.

# GANANOQUE

Is a prosperous field. The want so long mourned is now being met. A parsonage has been purchased and the body of a respectable church erected. The friends have nobly met all financial claims. Several additions have been made to the church, and a growing influence manifested in the various departments of the work.
