

sembly with the object of ascertaining their attitude on the question. "I approached the subject in a spirit of inquiry and was mindful that if the legalisation of Sunday baseball is secured it would be essential to so conduct the games as not to give offense or cause annoyance to that portion of the community which devotes the day to religious observance." In his letter President Ruppert pointed out that the obsolete law under which the prohibition is now enforced was enacted in response to the sentiment of a primitive community, differing vastly from that of the present age.

RUPPERT FAVORS SUNDAY BASEBALL

Yankee Owner Fines Many Candidates in Favor of Sport on Sunday

New York, Nov. 5.—Jacob Ruppert, president of the Yankees, who has been working with C. H. Ebbets of Brooklyn in sounding the candidates of all parties for the next assembly on the question of Sunday baseball, has met with surprising results among the Manhattan candidates and the Bronx, as the majority of them are in favor of

an amendment eliminating the old blue law which now prohibits Sunday games.

The law which the baseball people want amended was passed in 1877, and reads as follows: "All shooting, hunting, fishing, playing, horse racing, gaming and other public sports, exercises or shows upon the first day of the week and all noises disturbing the peace of the day are prohibited."

President Ruppert said yesterday: "Believing that a majority of the voting population of New York city desires the amendment of the law which prohibits Sunday baseball, so as to permit the lovers of clean sport to witness their favorite game on the only day of leisure most of them have, I have worked, in conjunction with President Ebbets of the Brooklyn club, and have sent out a letter of inquiry to all the candidates from New York and the
