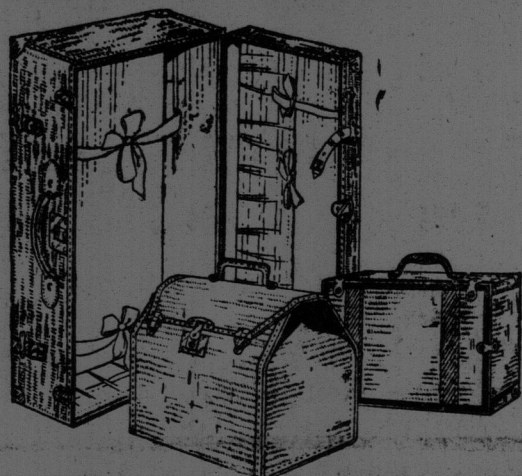

## WELSH HEROES HOME FROM THE SOMME

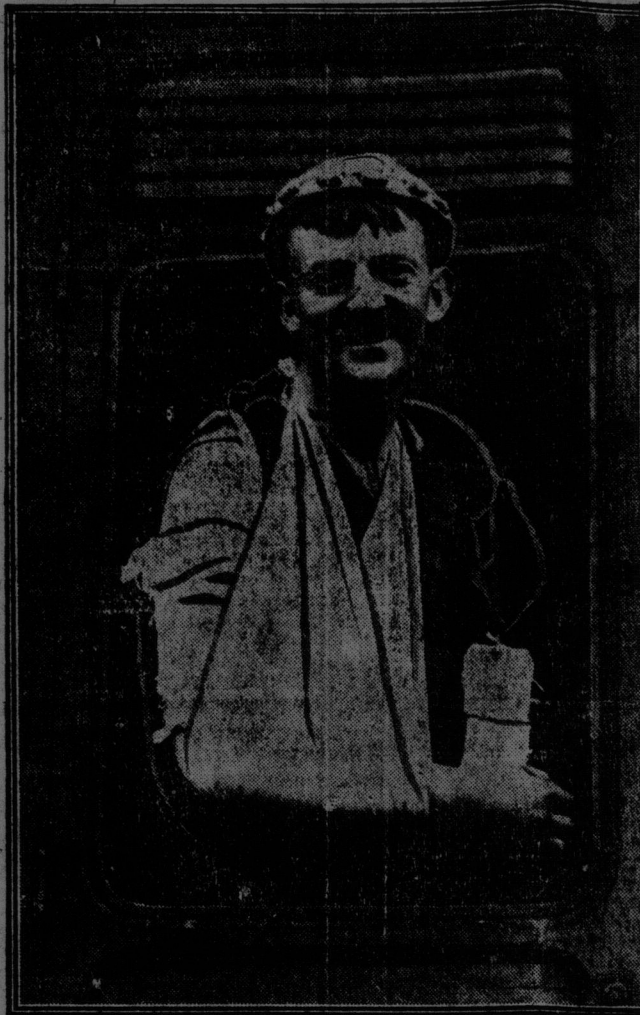


Photo shows a wounded "Tommy" arriving in England, one of the first to be invalided home from the big British drive on the Somme river. His arm may be broken, but his smile is not.

## LOCAL NEWS

Another increase is reported in Manitoba and Ontario flour. Manitoba flour is advancing twenty cents a barrel, while Ontario flour has advanced twenty-five cents.

W. H. Plummer, for the last nine years manager of the shoe department of the Sussex Mercantile Company, at Sussex, N. B., has returned to the city and will manage the Wilson's store in Union street. He will enter upon his new duties August 1.

An automobile, owned by Logan & McKenney, and a street car came together in Main street Saturday evening. Fortunately no one was injured; the auto sustained slight damage to the fender and the steering gear.

The local fire department were called out to attend two small fires Saturday evening. One was in the premises of P. M. O'Neil in North Wharf. The other was in the house of George Eatey, Kennedy street. A small fire was discovered in the fire—in neither case was there much damage.

It is reported that there will be an increase in fire insurance rates in the near future. The cause is attributed to the loss that all the fire insurance companies have met within the last few years. It is said that insurance losses in Canada last year reached \$20,000,000, while premiums were \$15,000,000. It is to meet this deficit that rates are being increased.

The provincial crown lands department reports that the lumber cut on crown lands last winter was 240,000,000 feet, \$2,000,000 less than the previous year. The total stumpage paid to the government is \$262,624.75. The largest payments are: Bathurst Lumber Company, \$67,198.68; Richards Mfg. Company, \$31,213.44; Shives Lumber Company, \$25,190.97; J. B. Snowball Company, \$21,805.17; and Dominion Pulp Company, \$17,871.92.

Three Killed in Action; Six Recruits Received on Saturday; Minister of Militia Arrives in London

The names of eight New Brunswick men appear in the midnight casualty list: Killed in action, E. N. Flagg, Grand Manan; Lewis A. Gagnon, New Mills; wounded, Oliver Dewar, Campbellton; Ernest Forsythe, General Station; Lance Corporal Arthur Roy, Elm tree; Robert M. Koswick, Buctouche; killed in action, Lance Corporal A. Y. Clements, Fredericton; wounded, Sapper G. D. Berton, 20 Munster street, St. John.

Six recruits were secured at the recruiting office in Prince William street on Saturday: W. London, L. McDonald, W. C. Bailey, Edward Pottle, St. John; Charles McLearn, Halifax; George LaPointe, Amherst.

Philip Grannan, accompanied by Mrs. Grannan and Mrs. Frank Foster, returned on Saturday after a trip to Montreal and Quebec. They also visited the Valcartier camp and while there were entertained by Lt.-Colonel Beer of the 140th Battalion and other officers of the same unit. Mr. Grannan says the camp as a whole, is very beautiful. The recreation ground was well laid off and various forms of amusement had been provided for the men. Mr. Grannan added that the boys of the 140th Battalion were much delighted to see some folks from St. John.

Sir Sam Hughes, Canada's minister of militia, arrived in London yesterday, and upon his arrival was interviewed by a group of reporters. Apparently the minister's visit will not be long, as it is understood that he will immediately proceed to the front.

Major McWilliam and Major Laurie left on Saturday night for St. Andrews. Major Laurie will return to the headquarters of the New Brunswick Command, while Major McWilliam will remain at St. Andrews and put the Fourth Pioneer Battalion through a course of instruction.
