HINTS FOR THE COOK

For home pudding take two cupsful of flour, one cupful of sugar, one tablespoonful of butter, one egg, one teaspoonful of baking powder, one cupful of milk.

Pineapple Delight. Peel and cut a medium-sized pineapple into cubes, add the juice of one lemon, sweeten to taste, then add 1/2 pound of marshmallows cut into quarters.

Cut the chicken into six or eight pieces and season well with salt and pepper. Dip in beaten eggs and then in fine bread crumbs in which there is a teaspoon of chopped parsley to every small cup of crumbs.

Slice cold potatoes, a small onion and one cold hard-boiled egg into a dish and sprinkle a little pepper and salt over them.
