WAS SENIOR
EPISCOPAL
PRELATE OF U.S.

Office Passes With Death of
Bishop Tuttle—Probably
Led All in World in Per-
iod of Service.

The Rt. Rev. Daniel Sylvester
Tuttle, presiding bishop of the Episco-
pal church in the United States and
the oldest Anglican bishop in point of
service in the world, who died at his
home in St. Louis on Tuesday, was
eighty-six years old.

He had been ill since Feb. 28, when
he suffered an attack of la grippe.
Hope for his recovery was abandoned
two weeks later, and his vitality shown
in his remaining alive since then has
been ascribed as astounding by attend-
ing physicians.

With the aged prelate's death, says
an Associated Press despatch, passed
the system of awarding by seniority
the office of presiding bishop in the
United States, which Bishop Tuttle
held by seniority since 1903. Under an
arrangement voted at the Episcopal
general convention in 1919, however,
direction of the church's affairs has
been placed in the hands of a national
council, with an elected bishop as
head. Bishop T. G. Gailer of Memphis
heads this council at present.

During his illness, the venerable
churchman was, at times, unconscious
for long periods, while at other times
he took nourishment and read
from his prayer book.

"Now I Lay Me Down to Sleep,"
was the prayer he would mumble. It
was his favorite prayer.

"I have never given up the habit of
repeating this prayer," he would say.
Last August Bishop Tuttle presided
at the opening of the general conven-
tion in Portland, Ore., and received
congratulations from all parts of the
country.

The bishop's statue stands in the
reveries of Christ Church cathedral. It
was placed there in 1912, as members
of the congregation wished to confer
the distinction on the prelate of having
his statue placed there while he was
still alive.

The bishop was opposed to woman
suffrage, and favored local option as
against statewide prohibition.

Coadjutor Bishop Frederick Foote
Johnson becomes, by automatic pro-
cess, the bishop of Missouri, succeed-
ing Bishop Tuttle. He is related to the
family of the late Mrs. Tuttle.

Bishop Tuttle was the patriarch of
the United States, because in length of
service as a bishop he outdistanced
every other bishop in his church and,
it is believed, in every other church.
He was consecrated in 1867, and hence
had served as bishop for more than
half a century.

He was born in Windham, N. Y.,
eighty-six years ago, and his education
was received at Columbia and the Gen-
eral Theological Seminary in New
York city. He served five years as as-
sistant rector of Zion Church, Morris,
N. Y., during which time he married
Miss Harriet M. Foote, the rector's
daughter.

In 1867, at the age of thirty, he was
appointed missionary bishop of Mon-
tana, having jurisdiction also in Utah
and Idaho. Leaving his wife and son
behind, he made the trip by stage
coach through a territory infested by
hostile Indians.

In 1880, after many years of request,
Montana was given a bishop by her-
