Splendid Showing Made in St. John-Albert By Standard Bearers of the Party-Candidates Promise Vigorous Support in Interests of Port Development.

The people of St. John returned two Conservatives to the House of Commons yesterday while the rest of Canada was roilling up a big Liberal majority. But even so, the Liberals made a great-showing in St. John-Albert and the large gathering that assembled at Liberal head-quarters in the Furlong building in Charlotte street found ample cause for rejoicing as the returns came pouring in from all parts of Canada from the Atlantic to the prairies announcing the election of Liberal after Liberal.

Hon. J. B. M. Baxter, minister of customs and excise in the Meighen government, and Dr. Murray MacLaren, C. M. G., were returned from this constituency. Dr. Baxter polled 11,653 and Dr. MacLaren polled 10,889 votes. They were closely followed by the Liberal candidates, H. R. McLellan, with 10,465 and Dr. W. P. Broderick with 9,573. The Progressive candidates trailed far in the reat, F. A. Campbell having 1,252 and W. M. Calhoun, 951.



## IRELAND ON SAME FOOTING AS CANADA

Lord Chancellor Speaks at Birmingham-Outlines the Status of New Irish Free

Birmingham, Dec. 6—"With one single important reservation," declared Lord Birkenhead, in an address here today, "we place Ireland, and I shall define Ire-

The Lord Chancellor said one must face the contingency that Ulster might say she was not prepared to send representatives to the allied Ireland parliament. If it was Ulster's attitude it was put one in your mouth at bedtime

The Lord Chancellor said the terms of the instrument agreed upon gave a free option to Ulster. If within a month of the passing of the statute Ulster determined she would retain her existing powers she should retain them. If equally she elected to retain her membership in the British House of Commons that decision would be profoundly respected. He said North Ireland would be well advised if she contributed her sobriety and business experience to the parliament, which would not otherwise be represented by such characteristics. He declared Stinf Fein had given reasonable guarantees for the protection of the minority in South Ireland.
