## GORMAN GETS THIRD PLACE

Finishes Meet With 80 Points  
—Jewtraw First With 120  
and McWhirter Second With 90.

By taking second place in the 440 yards at the National Skating Championships, which were concluded in Saranac Lake yesterday Charles Gorman of this city finished third with eighty points to his credit. Charles Jewtraw, of Lake Placid, won the championship with a total of 120 points, while Roy McWhirter, of Chicago, was second with ninety points. The 440

yards was the most sensational of the entire meet, Jewtraw, Gorman and McWhirter were bunched at the finish and all three dove for the tape. Jewtraw won the three mile, when Joe Moore of New York, who had been leading fell on the last lap.

Martin Brewster of Lake Placid, won the junior championship for boys of 16, Harold Fortune for boys of 14, and Daniel Van Norwick, of Saranac Lake, took the honors for boys in the 12-year-old class.
