4th .- And be it further enacted that such two Members for the town of Saint John shall be elected and chosen by the Freeholders and Householders of the said Town resident within the limits aforesaid under such and the like qualifications rules and regulations as are in force and practice touching and concerning the election of District Members of the said Assembly-Provided nevertheless that no Freeholder or Freeholders Householder or Householders who shall or may vote in the election of the Members for the said Town shall thereby be excluded or prevented from voting in the election of Members for the said District of Saint John.
