Shipping Notes.  
The government steamer Aberdeen arrived in port last evening and for the next few weeks will take the steamer Lansdowne's work while the latter is repairing.

The schooner Helen Shafter proceeds from Halifax to Hastings to load coal for Chatham, thence to New York with laths and back to Halifax with hard coal.

The British ship Eskoson, 1,760 tons register, built at London in 1888, and owned by the Eskoson Ship Co, has been sold to Lieut Gunderson, Portland, Me. She is now called Proctor.

The backstine Nora Higgins, which has been laid up at Shelburne all winter, has been chartered to load lumber at Moose River for Cuba and Jamaica.

The schooner Gypsum Express, now at Halifax, has been chartered to load laths at Barachois, Gaspe, for New York or Philadelphia.

The cost of floating ten schooner Laura C, Captain Crosser, of Lunenburg, recently ashore at Mobile, was about \$4,000. She is partially insured in a company which is now insolvent.

The Vinita, Captain Freeman Himmelman, recently lost at sea, had \$5,000 in the same company.

The steamship Oakland arrived a few days ago at Sydney from the Tyne, and goes on charter for the Dominion Coal Company in their St. Lawrence trade. The steamer represents the very latest in collier construction, has three large hatches, self filling carriers, and her own discharging apparatus is equipped with cranes. She is 2,250 tons dead weight and will carry 500,000 tons of coal. She is now loading for Montreal.

British ship Ancon, Capt. Ritchie, reached the river from Newcastle, N. S. W, last evening. Before she had been at sea long her sailors showed a disposition to mutiny and the skipper put into Sydney. The vessel remained at that port several weeks before resuming the voyage to Portland. She is bringing a cargo of coal. Because of

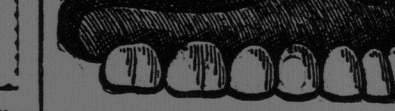

## ALBERT COUNTY'S NEW SHERIFF SWORN IN

HOPEWELL HILL, May 3.—The bay steamer Wilfred C, which has been in winter quarters in St. John, arrived at Harvey on Friday and left yesterday for Grand Manan, conveying the household effects and family of Rev. A. F. Brown, formerly pastor of the Harvey Baptist church, who has taken charge of a church on Grand Manan.

The steamship Gogovale, Captain Hood, which arrived at Hopewell Cape on Thursday to load deals for W. B. Dickson, will begin to take in cargo tomorrow or Tuesday. The Gogovale is a British ship of 2,200 tons, and made the run from the Tyne in fourteen days.

Captain B. T. Carter, Albert county's new sheriff, was sworn in on Thursday by Clerk of the Peace M. E. Dixon. Captain Carter is the seventh holder of the sheriff's office since Albert county was set off from Westmorland in 1846, his predecessors being Thomas Gilbert, who first held the office; Joseph Reid, Silas Lynde, Asad Wells, Williams Woodworth and E. W. Lynde.

John M. Tingley of this place and Nicholas Pearson of Riverdale have been appointed road superintendents for Hopewell parish, succeeding R. C. Smith and D. W. Stuart, who held office under the late government.

Rev. Mr. Snelling, the newly elected pastor of the Hopewell Baptist church, will be on the field next Sunday, May 10th.

CAIRO, Egypt, May 3.—A British subject, Scott Moncreiff, deputy inspector of the Blue Nile province, together with a native official, has been assassinated at the instance of a local sheik, who proclaimed himself prophet of Mohammed, about one hundred and fifty miles from Khartoum.
