### GUVERNMENT MAY BUY TEN MILLIONS OF G.T.P. BONDS

OTTAWA, March 9. — Negotiations are understood to be at present in progress between the Dominion government and the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company for the purchase of the government of ten million dollars worth of the company's bonds. In the event of the proposed purchase by the government of the company's bonds being approved by the cabinet, the arrangement will of course be submitted to parliament for ratification. The proposal is based on the very heavy cost of constructing the Grand Trunk Pacific line and the comparative low price which high class securities of this order at present command in the English market.
