



FALL RIVER, Mass., Sept. 13-Th 1,000 weavers employed at the Falt River Cotton Mills, which are con-trolled by M. G. D. Borden, of New York, failed to report for work today in accordance with their announced intention of striking for an increase in wages. Although but one-fifth of the employees of the six mills were af-fected, there was a probability that unless the strikers and the mill opera-tors reached an agreement during the day, all the depratments would be closed down, throwing 5,000 operatives out of work.
