THE COURTS

Judgment for Plaintiff in Frodham vs. Petropolis in County Court.

In the county court yesterday afternoon the jury in the case of John Frodham vs. Petropolis returned a verdict for the full amount sued for, \$108.45. The jury were out thirty five minutes.

This was an action brought by the plaintiff against the defendant on a co-owner of the fruit store on the corner of Union and Coburg streets for the recovery of the value of a photograph and records valued at \$108.45.

The defendant claimed that at the time the machine was bought he was not a member of the firm, and came into the business at a subsequent date. The trial lasted two days. Judge Forbes presided.

A stay of postea was granted. A. A. Wilson, K. C., and C. S. Handington appeared for the plaintiff and Daniel Mullin, K. C., and J. A. Barry for the defendant.

Mr. Mullin told the Standard that he was instructed to take the case to the supreme court on appeal. Argument on appeal will be presented at the November sittings of the supreme court on bench.

Exchequer Courts. The case of G. S. Mayes vs. the King was up for a few minutes in the exchequer court yesterday morning, with Mr. Justice Cassels presiding. E. H. McAlpine, K. C., for the defence, moved to amend the statement of defence as outlined in the Standard yesterday morning. Judge Cassels decided that the motion would rest on the evidence brought out in the case. The court then adjourned until this morning at 10 o'clock, when the case of Reid and Co. vs. the King will be taken up. It is not likely that the evidence in the Mayes case will be reached before Thursday or Friday.

GRIPPEN INDICTED BY GRAND JURY

Bill Returned Charging Dentist With Being Principal in Murder of Belle Elmore and LeNeve Accessory.

London, Oct. 11.—It is probable that the trial of Dr. Hawley H. Crippen and Ethel Clare LeNeve, for the murder of the former's wife, Cora Belle Crippen, known by the stage name of Belle Elmore, will be opened on Monday. The case was presented to the grand jury today by the recorder, who reviewed the evidence presented at the preliminary proceedings.

The recorder said that he considered it doubtful that Miss LeNeve knew committed, but he recommended that a true bill charging her with being accessory after the fact be brought against her, as he was confident that every consideration would be shown the young woman. A bill in keeping with this recommendation, and one charging Crippen as being the principal undoubtedly will be returned.

Crippen will be represented at his trial by three lawyers, the best known of whom are Alfred Aspinwall Tobin, Unionist member of parliament for Preston, and Huntly Eugene Jenkins. The two who will look after the interests of Miss LeNeve, F. E. Smith is a leading conservative member of parliament for the Walton division of Liverpool.
