TREASURY BILL ISSUE OF 15 MILLIONS WAS WELL RECEIVED IN LONDON

London, Nov. 4.—During the past week the feature of the London money market has been the issue of £15,000,000 six months treasury bills, the applications to which amounted to £43,162,000.
