Stables must be warmed by the heat from the bodies of the cows there confined. This can never be done when drafts of air go in at any crack and go out at a corresponding crack opposite.

Having plenty of barn room I built a silo in an empty bay at one end. The bay was cleared of all loose dirt and covered with small stones. These were cemented and thoroughly dried.
