Has been Presilt. of the Bowling Assoc. of Untario, Commodore of the Bay of Quinte Yacht Club, and Presdt. of the Lake Yacht Racing Assoc. Was for some years Presdt. of the Believille Curling Club, and was Presdt. of the Untario Curling Assoc. in 1895. Elected Mayor of the City of Belleville by acclamation in 1887. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1890, and reelected at g. e., 1894. A Liberal.—Belleville, Ont.

BLEZARD, THOMAS (East Peterboro').

B. in Tp. of Otonabee, Co. Peterboro', 24 Nov., 1838. Ed. in the Common School. M., 9 Dec., 1865, Mary Meikle. Sat nine years in Tp. Council, and five years in Co. Council. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. c., 1879, and re-elected at g. c., 1883, 1886, 1890 and 1894. A Liberal.—Villiers P.O., Ont.

Bronson, Hon. Erskine Henry (Ottawa).

Eldest s. of H. F. Bronson, Esq., a native of Warren Co., New York State, who settled in Can. in 1853. B. at Bolton, Warren Co., 12 Sept., 1844. Ed. at the Public and High Schools at Ottawa and at Sandy Hill, N.Y. M., at Norfolk, Virginia, in 1874, Ella, only dau. of Prof. N.B. Webster. Is Preedt. and General Manager of the Bronsons & Weston Lumber Co., Lim., extensively engaged in the manufacture of sawn lumber. Was a mem. of the City Council of Ottawa for seven years, and mem. of the School Board of the city for fourteen years. An unsuccessful candidate for Carleton, Ont., in the Commons at g. e., 1882.
