BILL.

An Act to Repeal the several Laws now in force in Upper Canada, regulating the Construction of Aprons to Mill Dams, and to make provision for better defining the mode of constructing the same.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal the Preamble.
several Laws now in force in Upper Canada, relating to the construction of Aprons to Mill Dams, and to define more particularly the width, elevation and depth of water passing over the same: Be it therefore enacted, &c.

And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That an Act of the Parliament of the late Province of Upper Canada, passed in the ninth year of Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the construction of Aprons to Mill Dams over certain streams in this Province*;"—also, an Act of the Parliament of this Province, passed in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to provide more effectually for the construction of Aprons to Mill Dams on streams in the District of Huron*;"—and a certain other Act, passed in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled, "*An Act to repeal the Act therein mentioned, and to make better provision for the construction of Aprons to Dams upon the River Moira*," and the Act thereby repealed be and the same are hereby repealed.

II. And be it enacted, That from and after the time when this Act shall come into operation, every owner or occupier, or owners or occupiers of any Mill Dam which
