Fortune Bay, and that the reference to the Law Officers of the Crown in the latter case is delayed pending the receipt of the Report which is awaited from the Governor of Newfoundland, and I am accordingly to request that Sir John Glover may be instructed to expedite the Report in question.

# Mr. Herbert to Mr. Lister .- (Received December 12.)

### The Marquis of Salisbury to Mr. Hoppin.

Foreign Office, December 17, 1879. Sir. I REFERRED to Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies Mr. Welsh's letter of the 13th August, together with its inclosure, relative to the case of the American schooner "Mist."

I now have the honour to transmit to you, for communication to your Government, the accompanying copy of a Report upon the case which has been received, through the Colonial Office, from the Governor of Newfoundland, by whose directions a judicial investigation was made into the matter.\*

Copies of the depositions of the several witnesses, taken upon oath, are annexed to

the Report; and I venture to express, on behalf of Her Majesty's Government, the hope that the United States' Government will share their opinion that there is no foundation for the claim attempted to be set up by the master of the "Mist."
