An Act to incorporate the Dominion of Canada Rıfle Association.

WHEREAS the voluntary association now existing under Preamble. the name of the Dominion Rifle Association has, by its petition, prayed that it be enacted as hereinafter set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition :
5 Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:-

The head office of the Association shall be in the city Head office. of Ottawa, in the province of Ontario. each annual general meeting, the Association shall elect a ${ }^{\text {ofticora. }}$ president of the Asbociation, a vice president for each province and a council composed of members of the Association elected to represent each province, the number of such representatives
