 ironic label since this *Viewpoint* (and *the Brunswickan* in general) does not give women the chance to show any enthusiasm for their own sex, let alone the excessive enthusiasm associated with chauvinism. Finally, to say that you are "more into humanism" when asked your opinion on "feminism" is not to say that you support all people, rather than just one group (be that group women, blacks, or otherwise). It is

to deny the voice and problems of the group in question. In this way the problems are left unvoiced and unsolved. Those already in power continue to dominate all others. This plea for humanism merely supports the dominant ideology; it does not strive towards a world of greater equality for all.

This *Viewpoint's* attitude is unfortunately typical of *the Brunswickan*. Chris Kane's cartoon in the same issue reads like a

taunt or challenge to women to say that such depictions of women are not accurate. Our silence on these issues will only confirm the convictions of people like Kane that women can and should be treated as butts for sexist humour.

In brief, *Viewpoint* - what do I think of it?: "Thpppt. Ack."
