Tower to check carbon monoxide near airport

MISSISSAUGA — Recent scientific research has indicated massive concentrations of carbon monoxide pollutants sometimes build up over highly travelled roads and can lead to a marked decrease in driver alertness and the speed of his reflexes. The Ontario Department of Energy and Resources, under George Kerr, is now trying to measure carbon monoxide concentrations beside Highway 401 in Mississauga.

A 40-foot tower has been installed on the south side of the super highway near the Toronto International Airport with monitoring equipment on top that detects the level of carbon monoxide from traffic, the direction and velocity of wind, and how quickly it disperses.
