

to know whether they are actually settled upon or not, and send them to some of the well known settlers in the vicinity and ask them to be good enough to fill them up or indicate thereon which are occupied and then return them to you. Failing to get this done you may write to each of the purchasers and enquire of them as to their occupations.

I may state that the object of securing this information is to be able to correct the number of lots included in the Garden River Indian Reserve.

So long a time having elapsed since you were first asked to do this, I have to request that you will extend your enquiries to the lots sold between the 7th Sept. 1880. and
