Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 29th Ultimo, in which you state that Roy H. Brigham and Edward Brigham have apparently located all the land to which they are entitled, and that by purchase they have exceeded that amount of land, I have to state that, in accordance with Section I of the Land Regulations, not more than four Lots of 100 Acres each, shall be sold to any one purchaser.

But such purchaser may by Assignment acquire additional lands from other purchasers, if he chooses to do so. He cannot, however, obtain Patents for more than four Lots, on the strength of improvements made on any one of such Lots, and furnishing satisfactory proof of occupancy of the land, either personally or by tenant, and of the performance of settlement duties as required by Section 3 of the Land Regulations.


He may, however, also obtain Patents for the additional Lots, upon furnishing sufficient proof of occupation and improvements made on such additional Lots for which he asks for Patents.
